In Memoriam

Each year we extoll the virtues of the founder of World Amateur Golfers Championship and once again it is no different. The record books speak for themselves as to his incredible achievements in the sporting world, and more importantly, for amateur golf on a global scale.

Sven Tumba's dream to unite the world through sport continues to be honored 22 years later as the championship takes place in Durban, KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa. Sven's generous spirit to give of his talents and time to enrich the lives of those around him lives on in his absence and will no doubt be a great conversation piece between him and his great friend Arnold Palmer as they walk the eternal 18 together.

Sven spent his time on this earth doing good for mankind and sport in general, way beyond his endeavours in golf. As a highly honoured three-sports star in Sweden, he played a pivotal role as an ambassador for ice hockey and football in his early sporting career. In 1999 Sven was awarded the "Best Swedish Ice-hockey Player Of All Times" and was inducted into the IIHF Hall of Fame in 1997. Today he still holds the Swedish scoring record of 186 goals (in 245 games) for the Swedish national team. In the mid-50's Sven also represented the Swedish national football team and was a Swedish champion in water skiing. His passion for golf developed in his later years after retiring from a successful career in ice hockey and football. In the early 1960's he took his first swing on Sweden's oldest golf course on Lidingo Island outside Stockholm and from that moment he was hooked.

Sven became a world-class golfer, a golf course designer and a worldwide ambassador of the sport. His passion pioneered the path for golf in Sweden, the former Soviet Union and gave rise to tournaments such as the Colgate Cup, the largest golf tournament for children. In 1970 he became the Founder and President of the European Open in the European Tour, a position that he held for 15 years. He also founded the Scandinavian Enterprise Open, now the Nordea Masters. On the 100th anniversary of the Swedish Golf Federation in 2004, Sven was named the most influential person in the history of golf in that country.

As a man of great vision, Sven was driven to promote golf on a global scale. It was his dream to give amateur golfers the opportunity to experience the same thrill of representing their country as a professional golfer in an international tournament. This dream was realised in 1995 when he founded the World Golfers Championship. As is custom, every year since his passing the Sven Tumba Spirit Trophy is awarded to one team in memory of his endearing, loving and kind spirit that he brought to the world of golf.

Touched by the spirit of children in need, Sven believed that he could use sport as a catalyst to capture their interest in promoting literacy, teamwork and a respect for each other, which gave rise to the Sven Tumba Education Fund.

Sven left the world with a legacy that lives on in the hearts of those touched by his zest for life. The friendships and business relationships that have been formed through his great vision to unite people through sport, regardless of language or cultural barriers, are testament to a legacy that is alive and prospering.

It remains our privilege and honour as golfers, to keep Sven's spirit alive through the World Amateur Golfers Championship.

He truly gave of his heart and soul to the game of golf and it gives us great pleasure to remember him as our Patron. In attempting to humbly acknowledge his contribution to the game of golf we have taken the liberty of quoting tributes from some key personalities in the world.

Arnold Palmer was a showman, a pitchman, a gentleman and a champion golfer. Indeed, Arnold Palmer was many things to many people, but perhaps more than anything, he was an everyman who would become the most beloved player the game has ever known



The event attracts 30 countries from around the World to attend a World Final which is a unique opportunity that only golf can offer due to the handicap system.



The Championship and The Invitational

World Amateur Golfers Championship and World Amateur Golfers

Invitational are two separate competitions played simultaneously by amateur golfers, giving them the opportunity to participate in a major world championship across 108 holes including practice days.

World Amateur Golfers Championship

For more than two decades the World Amateur Golfers Championship has inspired amateur golfers from around the world to take on the challenge within their own skill levels and receive the same status as the professionals, plus experience the proud feeling of representing their country in a world championship final, individually as well as in a team.

The Championship begins as a national elimination event in countries around the world, where winners from five handicap flights come together and represent their nation as a team and individually within their flights. If a flight winner cannot participate, the runner-up takes his/her place.

National teams from around the world challenge each other for the World Team Champion title, as well as the individual title within their flight.

World Amateur Golfers Invitational

The World Amateur Golfers Invitational is a division of the World Amateur Golfers Championship that gives golfers the opportunity to share in the experience of a worldwide championship event, without having to qualify. The Invitational is a 2-person team competition played on the same courses as the Championship and under the same format and rules

Business Networking Program

The Invitational caters to business executives, celebrities, VIP clients, sponsors, national organisers and golf enthusiasts. All participants are invited to take part in the Business Networking Program, where we pair our clients on the golf course based on their field of industry and pairing preferences, placing similar business interests in close proximity. Off the course, we offer even greater networking opportunities with our annual business networking evening, a casual meet-and-greet for our valued clients.

Format and Rules

Tournament Format

The tournament is played over 72 holes (4 courses), stroke play, with handicap adjustments after each round, giving all a fair and equal opportunity to become a world champion, both in the team championship and individually within each flight.

Team and Individual

Players in both the Championship and the Invitational compete for individual titles within each flight, as well as a team title.

The Championship Team Competition combines the best four scores (of five) per day from the national team, whereas the Invitational counts the combined total nett score of both team members after handicap deductions.

Handicap Flights

The Championship is played in five handicap flights and the Invitational in six handicap flights, each played separately.

Handicap Flights					
0-5	6-10	11-15	16-20	21-25	26-30*
* This flight is only in the Invitational, not in the Championship.					

All WAGC players compete in the handicap flights they qualified for and most will play with their exact handicaps, with the following exceptions:

- Players entering the world final with higher handicaps than the flights they qualified into will play with the highest handicap for their flight.
- Players who enters the world final with lower handicaps than the flights into which they qualified will play with their current handicaps, even though they are lower than the flight.

Accredited Referees

World Amateur Golfers Championship and Invitational uses accredited referees from golf federations during the world final. This ensures that the tournament is played under strict rules according to the rules of golf.

Handicap Adjustment

To cope with the varying handicap rules from around the world handicap adjustments are made after each round. This balances the scores and gives a fair game under equal conditions.

The adjustment is based on the players score against par, see handicap adjustment chart.

Equitable Stroke Control

Equitable Stroke Control sets a maximum number of strokes that a player can post on any hole during the tournament to par. + 3 In other words: If you are four over par on a hole, you pick up the ball and write the maximum strokes as shown below:

Maximum Strokes:

Par 3 = 6 strokes

Par 4 = 7 strokes

Par 5 = 8 strokes

This saves both time and frustration!
